#### GODPARENT / SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY

Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, fully-initiated Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civily, by a judge, mayor or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor). Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

#### PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD - MARCH 28, 2021

Liturgy Readings: Is. 50:4-7; Ps. 22:8-9,17-18,19-20,23-24; Phi. 2:6-11; Mark 14:1—15:47

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the *Triduum*—three days that are the highlight of the Church year.

During this week, we prepare ourselves for Easter by prayerfully reflecting on the events of Jesus' passion and death. Your family might display a crucifix in a prominent place as reminder of the salvation that Christ won for us. This can also serve as the focal point for family prayer during Holy Week.

Because of the length and complexity of the passion narrative, it is difficult for children to remain attentive when it is proclaimed in its entirety. Families can make it a tradition to read a portion of this Sunday's Gospel each day of Holy Week, providing ample opportunity for children to ask questions and respond to the events described there. In this way, the entire week can become a "way of the cross." Peace, Fr. Luke



- \* Holy Thursday April 1 The Washing of the Feet will be omitted.
- \* Good Friday April 2 -The Adoration of the Cross. Those venerating the Cross should not kiss it and should not make contact with the Cross, reverencing it with a genuflection or bow. Social distancing must be maintained, mask must be on.
